ACO Muskoka, the local branch of Architectural Conservancy Ontario, has been lucky enough to obtain a Young Canada Works grant to hire a local student to research and record Windermere's buildings and landscape.

The project will be based in the Windermere office of Catherine Nasmith Architect until the end of August.

Data gathered will be helpful in making a record of research into the historical buildings and sites in Windermere for walking tours in partnership with Muskoka Chautauqua, creating an article for publication in our ACORN magazine, and a presentation for residents of the area in mid to late August.

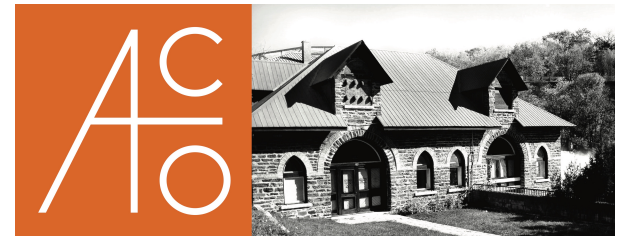
